

Batlokwa BaMokgalong as the senior tribe, form part of one of the

tribes that appear within the larger and Ancient and native Batlokwa nation that trace the origin from their parents Kgosigadi MmaThulare and Kgosi Kgwadi Tabane. Mokgalo who is the father of the tribe gave birth to a number of clients and family that are originally found in their native Orange Free State Colony. And later in the Eastern Cape and Kwazulu-Natal due to shrewd land dispossessions and merciless forceful removals in OFS Colony.

Batlokwa Ba Mokgalong have come a long way in their quest for self-preservation and identity through various ancient and modern ways of diplomatic negotiations with the colonial, the apartheid and the post-apartheid governments that led the government. It was in 1991 when the then apartheid administration succumb to the demands of the tribe, releasing the ancient land in magisterial districts of Frankfort, Rietz, Harrismith and Vrede to Batlokwa. Post-apartheid, the community has been seeking amicable solutions to release the land of their forefathers to their community of Batlokwa at large after their recognition as one of the traditional communities as stated in the Constitution of South Africa, it is the same struggle that gave birth to the Batlokwa ba Mokgalong Non-Profit Company which seeks to streamline the objectives to realise the vision of the community at large.

In the building of the Batlokwa ba Mokgalong Non-profit company and raising awareness for Batlokwa, the organization has spearheaded platforms on and off social media such as Batlokoa Youth Heritage Committee; clothing brands, logos and regalia under Royal Batlokwa, Ngwana Tlokweng, Proudly Tlokwa and Tlokwa.
